USEFUL INFORMATION SECTION

HOW DO I? PROCESS GUIDES

Do you ever think I wonder "how I do...?" - if you do then here is the answer for you. Whether you are a new leader or have been in Scouting for years these updated guides for the new Harrow District will be useful for you. They are stored on our Harrow District Scouts Members SharePoint site, at: https://harrowscouts.sharepoint.com/sites/HarrowDistrictMembers, in the folder "12. Process"

The first document you should look at is titled 'Please Read – How Do I... Processes Introduction'. This document explains how POR (Policy, Organisation and Rules) should be implemented at a local level in and who are the main contacts in Harrow for each process. If there are any discrepancies found between these guides and POR, then POR should always take precedence. Currently there are 4 How Do I... guides live, covering: How to Obtain or Renew an Activity Permit; Order Badges; Provide a Nights Away Notification; Apply for a Leader Award. More will be added over the coming weeks and months.

Revisions & Updates


If you identify any changes required to existing guides, please advise the Author of the relevant guide, who will review the changes requested and update the guide if required. The updated guide will then be submitted to Alan Sims to upload to the SharePoint site.

If you think a new guide is required, please notify Alan Sims of the details who can then review the request to see if it is or should be covered by an existing guide, or if a similar guide is in the pipeline to be produced. If a new [process guide is required, Alan will identify an owner to produce it and then add it to the SharePoint site.

The guides can be written by anyone, to describe how a process works for their particular area. Maintenance and updates of each guide will be the responsibility of the Guide author, with document version control, uploading documents to the SharePoint site and overall management being the responsibility of Alan Sims.
